



Winter Learning from Home Activites

- Look at tracks in the snow/frost compare the footprint patterns can children identify other tracks made by birds, cats or dogs? Within your family, look at individual footprints, discuss different sizes, shapes and patterns, can they put them in size order?
- Take a magnifying glass and go out and look at the frost/snow on plants and spider webs your children will be fascinated by what they can see.
- If it snows at some point, make a snowman using 3 balls of snow (if you are feeling really brave/clever you could even refer to them as spheres!!) compare the sizes. Measure the snowman's height by asking children to stand next to it, and judging whether it is taller, shorter, or the same as they are.
- If it doesn't snow, how about making snowmen pictures with potato prints/marshmallows
- How about making some beautiful coloured ice ornaments by freezing coloured water and then hanging them on the trees in the garden .
- Bird feeders, we have made these in the past, and may do so again, loads of messy fun!
- If all else fails you can just snuggle up and watch "The Snowman" or even "The Snowman and the Snow dog" there is so much to talk about in this, in particular the science of water, ice and rather heartbreaking melting or perhaps try one of our recommended winter reads or songs

(point to eyes)

All the snow falling down on me.

(flutter fingers downward)

When the weather's cold I'm strong and tall.

(stand up tall)

But when it's warm I get very small.

(crouch down low)
